Local History at the Ten Mile River Scout Museum 2014



Visitors will learn about the history and wildlife of the Upper Delaware River Valley at the Ten Mile River Scout Museum.

The Lumbering & Rafting Era

The Museum has artifacts and photos from the Lumbering and Rafting Era (1800s) and as far back as the Pioneering Era (1720s), including coins, tools, nails, horseshoes and metal buttons.

Native American Artifacts

We have arrowheads, stone tools and other artifacts from three Native American rock shelters found on camp property dating as far back as 6,000 years.



Donut Farm Exhibit

We have artifacts from the Donut Farm, a local family-owned restaurant on Route 97 dating back to the 1940s, including the famous donut machine.



Slide Farm Collection

We have a major collection of woodcarvings and neckerchief slides by Roland Flora, a local folk artist in the 1960s and 1970s and owner of the locally famous *Slide Farm*. This collection is a wonderful example of local handicraft.

Mounted Bird Collection

Our extensive mounted bird collection includes several birds-of-prey, including several owls, hawks, falcons and an osprey.



Museum Tour

First-time visitors typically go on a one-hour tour of the Museum, which includes a nine-minute video on the origin of the Ten Mile River Scout Camps.



Outdoor Exhibits

In addition to the Museum Building, we have several major outdoor exhibits nearby that you can visit.

Kernochan Blockhouse

A two-level Pioneer-era (1750s) reproduction miniature blockhouse. Inside on display are copies of common items that were typically used during the Pioneering Era. Find out how blockhouses were used in case of attack and what pioneer life was like in the Upper Delaware River Valley.



Cayuga/Kotohke Cabin

A recreation of life in an actual Brooklyn Scout Camps open-air cabin from the 1930s and 1940s, complete with bunks and straw



ticks. Oversized photos depict cabins and tents from this era. A nine-minute video depicts camp

life in the Brooklyn Scout Camps. Visit a mini-museum with camping equipment and other artifacts from typical 1940s Brooklyn Scout Camp life. See old



Our picnic area has drinking water, a Port-A-San, three charcoal stoves and picnic tables.




